Merseyside's Police and Crime Commissioner, Jane Kennedy, is updating the Police and Crime Plan for Merseyside for 2017/21.

Since 2010, Merseyside has witnessed a sharp increase in the number of people killed or seriously injured on our roads. **Last year, more pedestrians died or were seriously hurt per head of population than anywhere else in the country.**
